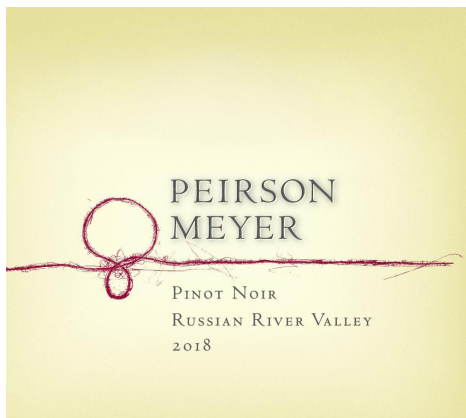

VINOUS Review

The 2018 Pinot Noir (Russian River Valley) is a soft, open-knit wine to drink now and over the next handful of years. Sweet spice, cedar and tobacco lend pretty aromatic nuance to a core of succulent red cherry and kirsch fruit. This mid-weight Pinot offers good immediacy and plenty of appeal for drinking over the near and medium term.

Russian River

Our Pinot Noir from Russian River is a blend from two vineyards (the Miller and Bateman Vineyards) that both lie at approximately 700 feet above sea level, near Occidental. Both are planted in Goldridge soils. The vines are trained on a vertical trellis system (VSP) on north eastern facing slopes that offer protection from the hot summer afternoon sun.
